1. Application Requirements

- 1.1 Applicants must have completed high school or passed an equivalent high school standard test or be currently in their final year of high school (Grade 12 in the US system or Year 13 in the British system).
- 1.2 Applicants must submit all of the following three documents and meet all three requirements.
 - 1.2.1 A high school transcript or its equivalence with a minimum GPAX of 2.75
 - 1.2.2 Applicants must achieve the prescribed minimum score in any one of the following English Proficiency tests:


-	TOEFL (Internet-based)	not lower than 79	or
-	CU-TEP	not lower than 79	or
-	IELTS	not lower than 6.0	or
-	SAT (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing)	not lower than 450	or
-	CU-AAT (Verbal)	not lower than 400	

1.2.3 Applicants must achieve the prescribed minimum score in any one of the following Mathematics tests:

-	SAT (Maths)	not lower than 650	or
-	SAT Subject Tests (Maths Level 2)	not lower than 650	or
-	CU-AAT (Maths)	not lower than 600	or
-	IB (Maths HL)	not lower than 6	or
_	A-Level (Maths)	not lower than B	

Applicants who wish to apply by using SAT (Evidence-Based Reading & Writing) and SAT (Maths) or CU-AAT (Verbal) and CU-AAT (Maths) must submit the scores of both parts from the tests taken on the same date.

The official score report of the tests in 1.2.2 and 1.2.3 is valid only when the tests were taken not more than two years prior to the application deadline. The SAT & SAT Subject Test score reporting code is 9080.



1.3 All applicants must have a history of good behavior and agree to abide strictly by existing and any future University regulations, codes and policies.

2. Application Package

Applicants must complete the application form in full and ensure that all information given is true and correct. All application forms must be accompanied by the following:

- One 1-inch photograph
- Academic transcript(s)
- Documents of qualifications according to item 1
- Enrollment certificate (only for those who have not yet fulfilled all requirements for a high school diploma/certificate)
- A copy of the applicant's passport

3. Evaluation Criteria

Eligible applicants will be evaluated on the basis of all three requirements and an interview. The weighting assigned to the requirements is as follows:

•	English proficiency test scores	35 %
•	Mathematics test scores	35 %
	Interview scores	30 %

4. Enrollment

In order to be eligible to enroll at Chulalongkorn University, applicants must have successfully completed an upper secondary or high school education. Applicants who have graduated from international schools in Thailand that have been accredited by the Ministry of Education may use their school transcript or diploma. In all other cases, they must possess an equivalent certificate issued by Chulalongkorn University.
